YOU are a mission-critical piece in the role Orchard Place serves as a safety net for lowa's youth and families. In too many cases, young lives are at risk and access to mental health services may be the difference between life and death. This year, one in four youths who came to us for evaluation had intent for self-harm including a plan for how to take their own lives and access to the means to do it. School surveys show these feelings of hopelessness are more common among LGBTQ students, female students, and students across racial and ethnic groups.

While the statistics are staggering, we can take heart in the stories of resilience. Via, a youth who recently completed our 24/7 treatment program at Orchard Place Campus, and her mother Sara are speaking out to inspire others to reach out for help.

"I definitely started out thinking that there was no future for me. That I didn't have a chance to be anyone or do anything in my life," said Via, "but as I worked on myself and got better in treatment, I realized that there was so much waiting for me that I had so many opportunities and things I could do with my life. I started doing better in school and working towards having a good future."

"For the families of the kids who come to Orchard Place, the biggest thing I want them to have is hope because we felt very hopeless when this process started," said Via's mom Sara. "I never thought that my daughter would be able to come home and be with us again. She is home again, and that's a miracle."

OUR BRANCHES OF SERVICE:

· Child Guidance Center:

Accredited outpatient community mental health center offering a wide variety of services including office and school-based therapy, psychiatric services, and psychological testing. Orchard Place's Child Guidance Center (CGC) is lowa's largest "safety net" provider for children's mental health and provides care to families regardless of their ability to pay.

CGC is also home to Iowa Child Care Resource & Referral which provides resources, education and advocacy to support quality child care. CCR&R assists families in finding care for their children and provides on-site consultation to licensed preschools, centers, nonregistered home providers and child development home providers in meeting regulations and quality improvement.

Orchard Place Campus:

Residential Psychiatric Medical Institute for Children (PMIC) serving children and adolescents. Treatment is provided by a multidisciplinary team including child and adolescent psychiatric providers, nurses, therapists, milieu treatment counselors, plus a recreational therapist, dietician, and other dedicated professionals.

PACE Center:

Community-based programs providing skill-building, substance-use treatment, Juvenile Court follow-up, Latino Outreach, and integrated health home services.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, INCLUSION

Orchard Place is committed to embracing and building a culture where diversity is valued, while creating a more equitable and inclusive environment for clients, families, employees, and community members. We know that establishing an environment that supports clients and families who receive mental health services is critical to their well-being, and Orchard Place strives to place diversity, equity, and inclusion practices at the forefront of our daily work.





IN 2023, THE CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER PROVIDED CARE TO 4,027 CHILDREN AND YOUTH.

- Conducted 39,140 outpatient treatment and psychiatric visits.
- Served 85 youth through the Functional Family Therapy program, helping 86% of youth to remain in the community at discharge.
- Provided 2,260 consultation visits to childcare programs, totaling 2,549 hours.

BASED ON YOUTH AND PARENT PROGRESS REPORTS:

90%

of youth/parents reported that therapy is helping them to recognize emotions and how they impact behavior.

66%

of youth showed a positive change in emotional, social, and behavioral functioning from intake to discharge. 89%

of families completing Functional Family Therapy reported an improvement in family relationships.

93%

of youth/parents reported satisfaction with the services received.

ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS

IN 2023, ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS SERVED 174 CHILDREN. THE AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY WAS 6.6 MONTHS.

IN 2023 AT ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS:

- **89**% of youth showed a positive change in emotional regulation from intake to discharge.
- 88% of youth showed a positive change in emotional, social, and behavioral functioning from intake to discharge.
- **98%** of youth successfully discharged to a lower level of care.
- **90%** of youth agreed with the statement "I am learning ways to help myself feel better here."

- **93**% of youth/families served reported feeling respected and encouraged to share thoughts and ideas.
- 1,074 youth received care coordination services from our Integrated Health Home and System of Care programs.


- **185** youth across six area high schools were served on behalf of Juvenile Court Services and the Des Moines Public School District.


ORCHARD PLACE SURVEY RESULTS


