VITAL STATISTICS

IN 2022, ORCHARD PLACE:

- Provided care to **7,029** Iowa children and youth
- Employed **350** staff members
- Engaged **335** volunteers
- Operated on a budget of **\$22.7 MILLION**
- Limited management and general expenses to only **8.52%** of the total budget

Orchard Place is a leading Iowa nonprofit organization dedicated to helping youth with mental and/or behavioral health challenges.

OUR BRANCHES OF SERVICE:

- **Child Guidance Center:**
Accredited outpatient community mental health center for children and families.
- **Orchard Place Campus:**
Residential Psychiatric Medical Institute for Children (PMIC) serving children and adolescents. Treatment is provided by a multidisciplinary team including child and adolescent psychiatric providers, nurses, therapists, milieu treatment counselors, plus a recreational therapist, dietician, and other dedicated professionals.
- **PACE Center:**
Community-based programs providing skill-building, substance-use treatment, Juvenile Court follow-up and integrated health home services.

SANCTUARY INSTITUTE CERTIFIED



Orchard Place is the only provider in Iowa certified by the Sanctuary Institute. This certification symbolizes our organization's commitment to providing a higher level of care, a trauma-sensitive environment for the children and families we serve, and a better work environment for our team members.

The Sanctuary® Model is a blueprint for clinical and organizational change which, at its core, promotes safety and recovery from adversity through the active creation of a trauma-informed community.

ORCHARD PLACE DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION COMMITMENT



CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER

IN 2022, THE CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER PROVIDED CARE TO 4,164 CHILDREN AND YOUTH.

BASED ON YOUTH AND PARENT PROGRESS REPORTS:

- Conducted **41,367** outpatient treatment and psychiatric visits.
- Served **67** youth through the Functional Family Therapy program, helping **75%** of those completing the program stay in their homes.
- Provided **2,030** on-site/virtual consultations to childcare programs, totaling **2,620** hours.

90%

of youth/parents reported that therapy is helping them to recognize emotions and how they impact behavior

67%

of youth showed a positive change in emotional, social, and behavioral functioning from intake to discharge

94%

of youth/parents reported satisfaction with the services received

94%

of families completing Functional Family Therapy reported an improvement in family relationships

ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS

IN 2022, ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS SERVED 210 CHILDREN. THE AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY WAS 6.1 MONTHS.

IN 2022 AT ORCHARD PLACE CAMPUS:

- **76%** of youth showed a positive change in emotional regulation from intake to discharge.
- **75%** of youth showed a positive change in emotional, social, and behavioral functioning from intake to discharge.
- **98%** of youth successfully discharged to a lower level of care.
- **78%** of youth agreed with the statement "I am learning ways to help myself feel better here."



Our son was developing behavioral health issues I wasn't equipped to manage on my own. We found Orchard Place through the recommendation of another family.

While receiving behavioral health intervention services (BHIS), our son began seeing a therapist he really connected with who referred him to the intensive residential program at Orchard Place Campus.

PACE CENTER

IN 2022, PACE CENTER SERVED 2,655 YOUTH AND FAMILIES.

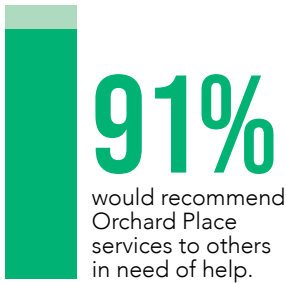
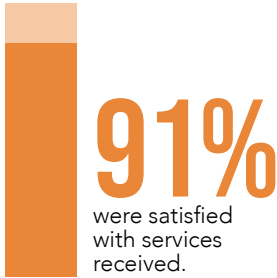
- **96%** of youth/families served reported feeling respected and encouraged to share thoughts and ideas.
- **1,051** youth received care coordination services from our Integrated Health Home and System of Care programs.
- **251** youth across six area high schools were served on behalf of Juvenile Court Services and the Des Moines Public School District.
- **517** youth received skill-building services from PACE case managers.
- **270** youth received substance use services.



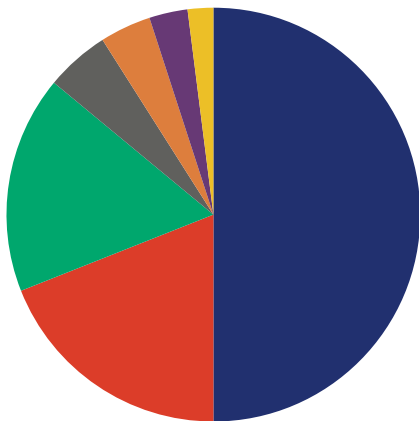
